Rental Term(s):

Full: June 1st – May 31st or

Partial: September 1st – May 31st

Lease Agreement:

Security deposit due upon signing the lease agreement. Security deposit will be equal to one month’s rent.

Rent varies by house and by single or shared bedroom. Rent will be spelled out in the terms of the lease as agreed upon by Tenant and Landlord.

If the entire rent is paid at the beginning of the lease, you receive a \$200 reduction in total rent (for 12 month leases).

All Rent covers utilities (gas, water, and electric), wireless internet, basic cable, and a washer/dryer. Parking is available at both houses, and bedroom furnishings are available upon request for both houses.

Upon acceptance, you will be contacted to sign a formal lease agreement.

Living Arrangements

You are not only being rented a place to live, but also a place to minister to, and serve, college students. Living in the campus house provides you with the opportunity to experience living in a Christian community, and the opportunity to work & serve together to impact the lives of people on and around campus with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Personal property should be maintained and operated in a way that is consistent with the nature and purpose of the house (i.e. no loud/late or inappropriate music). His House Christian Fellowship assumes no liability or responsibility for the personal property of the residents. Residents are advised to purchase renter's insurance if loss of property is not covered under their parents' homeowners' policy. Personal property stored outside the resident's room must be labeled and stored in an approved location. Property left at the campus house after checkout will be disposed of and costs incurred will be deducted from the renters' deposit.

House, Rooms, & Furnishing

The Campus Houses are an integral part of the campus ministry. Therefore, the first floor of the houses are public areas, open to all students in our ministry and from the college campus. The second floors are the living quarters for the residents.

Arrangements need to be made in advance with the Campus Minister for furnishings provided by His House Christian Fellowship. House furnishings must remain in rooms unless approved by Campus Minister.

In order to help us exhibit the character quality of responsibility, the furnishings must be kept in reasonable condition. Undue damage is the responsibility of the residents. All maintenance

problems should be directed to your House Manager who will in turn let the Campus Minister know. Absolutely no painting or remodeling is to be done without permission of the campus minister or Landlord.

Christian Conduct and Spiritual Life

Since we are Christians and represent Jesus Christ, we desire to set a Godly example in all aspects of life. Therefore, use of tobacco in any form, alcoholic drinks, and illegal drugs are not allowed on the Campus House property. Neither should there be any use of profanity at any time. Guests of the residents are the responsibility of the resident and must be consistent with the witness of the house. Willing violation of these rules means you may be asked to move out. Members of the opposite sex are welcome at the campus houses, however they are not allowed in the bedrooms on the second floors, so as to provide privacy and avoid temptation, and set a Godly example for others. It is expected that the residents will make every effort to be involved in the weekly fellowship meetings, the Fall and Winter Retreats, house activities, house meetings and other activities sponsored by the campus ministry.
